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Media Talking Points

Overarching Headline Statement:

 More than ever, our University of Hawai'i needs a president who respects our Island culture, but who also has the courage to reorganize the UH system so that the money of Hawai'i's taxpayer's can be put to better use.

Main Supporting Points:

- Genuine commitment, accountable
 Our new president must genuinely care about educating Hawai'i's citizens. We cannot afford to have a president who is self-serving. We need someone willing to be accountable to Hawai'i's citizens, who ultimately are the ones who pay his or her salary.
- Personalize experience; advocate for community colleges
 We can no longer be Mānoa-centric. The UH system is composed of
 10 campuses statewide. As a professor at Kapi'olani Community
 College, I have felt the effects of being among those forgotten at the
 community colleges. It's time to make students our priority. We need
 a new president who understands the value of all the campuses and
 appreciates the diverse student population across the system.
- Reduce redundancy because of impact on quality and costs
 There is too much redundancy at all levels within the UH system.
 There are duplicate bureaucracies that have been replicated on the separate campuses. This has negatively impacted the quality of student interaction and added unnecessary costs to operate the UH system.
